



# Domaine de Rochebin

**THE DOMAINE:** The history of Domaine de Rochebin dates back more than 1,000 years when its vineyards were part of the legendary Abbey of Cluny, whose monks produced some of the world's most prized wine enjoyed by Church dignitaries, royalty, pilgrims and followers for over 8 centuries. Located in the village of Azé in the Mâcon, today most of the Domaine's 46 hectares come from the Abbey's former properties. The estate itself was established in 1921 by the Marillier family. Jean-Pierre and Mickaël Marillier, along with Mickaël's wife Marie-Pierre, representing the family's 3rd and 4th generations, now operate the estate. Laurent Chardigny has been in charge of winemaking since 2008. The Domaine produces the four noble grapes of Bourgogne, growing 18 ha of Chardonnay, 16 ha of Gamay, 7 ha of Pinot Noir and 5 ha of Aligoté. These filigreed wines offer a delicious value that is becoming increasingly rare in the world of Burgundy.

**VINIFICATION:** Partial destemming, transferred to vats by gravity, maceration, daily punched downs, 12-day vatting period (25 - 30° C), horizontal pressing, settling, malolactic fermentation, and ageing in oak barrels (6 to 8 months) prior to bottling.

**WINEMAKERS NOTES:** With its purple color, this wine develops aromas of red and black fruits (strawberry, cherry, blackcurrant, blueberry) evolving towards cooked prune and peppery nuances. In the mouth it is structured and round. Its tannins and the fruit hold a good head-to-head.
