MEURSAULT GENEVRIÈRES

PREMIER CRU

The plots that make up the Meursault Premier Cru Genevrières appellation are located in the heart of the appellation's premier cru hillside. The soil is clay-limestone with a subsoil made up of either rocky scree, lava or rocky bottoms (white limestone).

We farm two plots halfway up the hillside, between 250 and 275 metres above sea level. The first is located in the heart of the hillside and the second is on the edge of the Meursault premier cru Poruzot on the east side. A regular slope of 10 to 25% allows for a good exposure.

This wine is very characteristic of Meursault, presenting a lot of finesse, minerality and opulence at the same time, with a good length but without heaviness.

Exhibition: South/Southeast at an altitude of 250 to 275 meters

Area: 0.77 hectare

Grape variety: Chardonnay

Waist: Pruning the vines in cordon de Royat and simple Guyot

Guard: To be drunk generally between 5 and 10 years after bottling.

Tasting: Floral on the nose, wide and long in the mouth, it goes very well with foie gras, poultry, white meats and fatty cheeses.
